Nissan Z Cars Exhibit to open at Lane Motor Museum **October 11, 2007 through July 28, 2008**

Featuring Z Cars from the Nissan North America Heritage Collection

Nashville TN, October 5, 2007--- The Nissan Z Cars exhibit will open Thursday, October 11, 2007 as part of a continuing showcase of the Nissan Heritage Collection vehicles at Lane Motor Museum. The exhibit will run through July 28, 2008 and regular admission rates apply.

Visitors will be able to explore Nissan's revolutionary rise in the sports car market from the 1970 240Z to a 2002 350ZX. Included is the 1974 260Z owned by Mr. Yutaka Katayama, former President of Nissan North America and known as "The Father of the Z Car". Seven different Z cars will be featured in the exhibit.
