***Lane Motor Museum Vehicles Invited to Display at the  
Food Lion AutoFair – Lowe’s Motor Speedway, Charlotte, N.C.  
April 6 – April 9, 2006***

*Nashville TN, March 29, 2006.* Four “unique” Lane Motor Museum vehicles will be shown during the Food Lion AutoFair at Lowe’s Motor Speedway in Charlotte, N.C., April 6 to April 9, 2006. A special display held in the Food Lion Pavilion, will feature several unusual vehicles with land, sea, and air capabilities. Guests of all ages will be fascinated by the four Lane Motor Museum unique and unconventional vehicles that will be a part of this special event display.

The Lane Motor Museum vehicles on display at the Food Lion AutoFair include:

- **1928 Martin Aerodynamic**, a one-of-a-kind aerodynamic vehicle built by the Martin Aircraft Company. This vehicle has an airplane-type suspension – which means no springs. The aluminum body has one door that opens into the back seat.
- **1934 McQuay-Norris Streamliner**, which was created as a test vehicle and has a multitude of gauges mounted on the dash to monitor performance of various components. Only six of these vehicles were produced. This particular McQuay-Norris was driven over 4,000 miles from Washington, D.C., to Tacoma, Washington in the 2005 Great Race.
- **1946 Hewson Rocket**, a one-of-a-kind production vehicle concept created by William Hewson. The idea was to create a very aerodynamic shape with no projections anywhere – headlights covered with glass, tail-light lenses flush, and no outside door handles.
- **1948 Morgan “F” Super three-wheeler** is the only car of the four to be produced in any quantity. The Morgan has a barrel-backed body with the spare tire recessed in the tail.

In addition to the Lane Motor Museum vehicles, the Food Lion Pavilion will feature a 2002 Panoz Esperante painted to look like The Flying Red Baron from "Monster Garage," Steve Green's Tornado Attacker, and an Amphicar. Other attractions will include the "Globe of Death" motorcycle stunt show, a tribute to the Turbocharger, a collectible car auction conducted by Tom Mack Classics on Friday and Saturday, and an

automotive artist display featuring David Snyder from Millford, OH; Roger Blanchard from Pittsboro, NC; Garry Hill from Mooresville, NC; Charlie Maher from Bloomfield Hills, MI; and Dan McCrary from Charlotte, NC. The Food Lion AutoFair will also feature a gigantic flea market and a Manufacturers Midway with aftermarket merchandise.

### **About Food Lion AutoFair**

The April 6-9 Food Lion AutoFair is the world's largest automotive extravaganza and takes place at the Lowe's Motor Speedway, Charlotte, N.C. Hours are 8 a.m. to 6 p.m. on Thursday through Saturday, and 8 a.m. to 4 p.m. Sunday. Tickets can be purchased at the gate on event days. Tickets are \$10 for adults. Children under 12 are admitted free when accompanied by an adult. Tickets may be purchased in advance through the Lowe's Motor Speedway ticket office by calling 1-800-455-FANS. A two-day ticket is available for \$15. Parking for the event is \$5.

### **About Lane Motor Museum**

Lane Motor Museum showcases approximately 150 unique cars and motorcycles from around the world. Cars on display represent countries from Asia, Europe, North and South America, and date from 1922 to 2003. Highlights of the museum include the largest Czechoslovakian vehicle collection outside Europe, microcars, amphibious vehicles, alternative fuel vehicles, competition cars, and prototypes. The museum also offers a display of automotive art, a special play area for children, and a gift shop.

Lane Motor Museum welcomes guests Thursday through Monday from 10 a.m. to 5 p.m. Closed Tuesday & Wednesday; Thanksgiving Day, Christmas Day & New Year's Day. Regular admission is \$5 for adults, \$3 for seniors, and free for children 17 and under. Group rates are available. Lane Motor Museum is located at 702 Murfreesboro Pike just minutes from Downtown Nashville.
